Pastor's Desk

Growing up in Sunday School we would sing a song "O be careful little mouth what you say...". In our passage today James is telling us exactly the same thing but perhaps being a little more direct – "...it's time to stop talking because the words that are coming out are not honouring God..."

Our tongues are the deadliest weapon; untameable, a roaring fire, striking to the very heart of another person and often worse than our actions. James has already said that we should be "...quick to listen, slow to speak and slow to become angry." How are we doing with that?

He goes on to use the illustration of figs, olives and grapes, and how they will always grow on their own tree. If we are a new creation in Christ how are our words, the ones we speak and even what we imply by our words, reflecting this? We should be putting out fires not starting them and seeking to please the Father and glorify Him with what we say.
